



# How to Apply

Applications must be submitted to a Windermere office for funding consideration. Please apply through an office local to the families you are serving. If you are serving a large geographic area, please limit your application submission to no more than three offices, which can be narrowed by determining your highest need zip code and applying to a Windermere office(s) in the surrounding area.

**Social service organizations that assist low-income and homeless families may apply for a grant through a local Windermere office.**

To find a Windermere office near you, visit [Windermere.com](https://www.windermere.com) and click “Agents” at the top of the page. Then click on “Have An Agent? Search Directory” and click on “Our Offices.” Enter your zip code in the search bar and click on the search icon.

Each office has a Foundation Representative who will receive and review your application. **Please contact the office for the name of their current Foundation Representative.** It’s at the discretion of each office or group as to which programs (applications) they would like to support with their Foundation funds.

Deadlines are determined at the local level, so please contact your local Windermere office/rep and ask if they have any deadlines for applying.

Grant amounts vary depending on the office you are applying through. In 2025 the average grant awarded was \$3,362.
